2. Exhibitor is responsible to read "General Rules" at beginning of Exhibitor's Guide.
3. All exhibitors must use official entry forms and they must be postmarked on or before August 11, to Fair Entries, 404 N Havana Street Ste 1, Spokane Valley WA 99202-4663.
4. All recipes entered may be used in the future by the Interstate Fair without compensation to the exhibitor.
5. Exhibitors must present claim ticket when picking up their exhibit and must not remove exhibit unless superintendent or assistant is present to check out the exhibit. No exhibit shall be withdrawn before Monday, September 21.
6. All cakes and breads must be on disposable plates **except wedding cakes or contest entries**.
7. No fresh fruit, custard, whipped cream, or cream cheese.

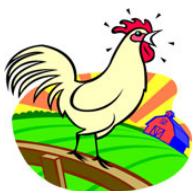
