BEEF DEPARTMENT RULES

- Livestock exhibitor is responsible to read "General Rules" as well as the Department Rules.
- All exhibitors must use official entry forms and they must be postmarked on or before August 11, to Fair Entries, 404 N Havana Street Ste 1, Spokane Valley WA 99202-4663. If housing remains, late entries will be accepted with entry fees doubled.
- The Spokane County Interstate Fair is aware of the Malignant Catarrhal Fever (MCF) Disease and is taking precautions to help prevent contraction of the disease. Exhibitors are asked to familiarize themselves with the disease and how it is spread / contracted in order to assist the Fair in their endeavor.
- Each animal may compete for one premium and may be entered in one class or lot, except in the case of pairs, best six head, get of sire, or produce of dam. Individual animals shown in group classes must have been entered and shown in the proper single classes preceding the groups. Exhibitors may make two entries and receive up to two cash awards in any one lot. Only one entry per group lot per exhibitor.
- Any animal with a questionable or illegible tattoo will be disqualified.
- BEDDING MUST BE COMPLETED PRIOR TO 8:00 A.M.** The Fair will furnish bedding. Fresh bedding / shavings will be available in bins or areas near the buildings where exhibits are located. Bedding / shavings may be delivered to each exhibitor's stalling area. Hay will be for sale on the grounds. Grain shall be furnished by the exhibitor.
- Nurse cows are prohibited.
- Bulls over one year must be shown with a nose ring.
- Fans are permitted in the barn with prior Superintendent approval.
- While the Fair will allow all classes for all breeds, exhibitors are expected to abide by the rules and policies of their respective associations. The Beef Superintendent will work closely with respective breed representatives for all point shows.
- Animals will be unloaded and put into assigned stalls and can be removed only for stall cleaning, exercising, and showing. Animals may be taken to designated areas only.
- Only classes 1 and 19 may be split at the Superintendent's discretion.**
- Open - Each breed or lot represented shall have a minimum of ten entries to compete for placings in the various classes. If there are fewer than eight entries in each breed or lot, the exhibitor shall either enter exhibits into an "Other Breeds" lot or elect to enter an "exhibit only" category for which the Fair may pay an exhibit fee of \$55.00 at the discretion of the Superintendent.
- MURRAY GREY SHOW RULES:** Only Murray Greys registered in the American Murray Grey Association (AMGA) or the Canadian Murray Grey Association (CMGA) are able to enter the National Show held in conjunction with the Interstate Fair.

15. **CLUB CALF RULES:** Club calf exhibitors must follow the rules of all livestock exhibitors (including calves must be halter broke). Steers must be of Club Calf quality. Club Calves may be any breed or crossbred. Calves will be sold private treaty only. All arrangements of sale and hauling are between the seller and purchaser solely and will not involve the Spokane County Fair and Expo Center. No animals will leave the grounds prior to the regular release time. Exhibitors may display a sign (18" x 24" maximum) with pertinent information, i.e. calf for sale, birth date, weight per day of age, etc. **Exhibits will be released on 09/14 at 4:00 p.m.**
16. **YOUTH RULES:** In addition to the above rules, no bull over six months of age may be shown in grooming and showing class. Blue ribbon winners in youth beef cattle will be eligible for open class competition for premiums upon: Proof of breed registration of winning animal (papers are required), payment of open class fees of \$15.00/animal, changes must be made within 2 hours of judging, and exhibitors will be subject to all open beef rules, classes and time schedules.
17. **MARKET STEER RULES: 2009 Sale Order – Sheep, Goats, Poultry, Rabbits, Swine then Beef. Exhibitors are strongly encouraged to obtain buyers / supporters for their exhibit.** Steers will sell in the order of show placing. Exhibitor is allowed one entry in this class. Minimum weight is 1000 pounds. Only steers receiving a blue or red ribbon will be sold at the market auction on Sunday, September 13, at 4:00 p.m. Steers sold at another show or fair may not be entered in the Spokane County Interstate Fair. Market steers will be weighed Friday (check schedule for time). The Livestock Superintendent or his designate is authorized to weigh livestock for any market class. Steers with horns cannot be shown. Scores less than two inches are allowed. **Blue Ribbon**, desirable prime and choice grades. **Red Ribbon**, less desirable prime and choice grades. **White Ribbon**, good quality grade carcass. Steers sold at auction will remain on the grounds until 4:00 p.m. on Monday, Sept. 14. Exhibitors are required to take their own animals through the sale and an exhibitor dress code will be enforced. Exhibitors are to return their sold animals to their assigned stalls. Exhibitors are responsible for feeding and watering their animals until 4:00 p.m. on Sept. 14. Market animals not meeting the required weight restrictions may be entered into a feeder class within three hours of being weighed. Please see additional information on the Market Stock Auction page near the front of the book. Exhibitor must complete Market Beef Health Record / Quality Assurance Form (at conclusion of Beef Department). Exhibitors arriving without a completed Quality Assurance Form will not be permitted to weigh in.
18. **HERDSMANSHIP CONTEST:** The purpose of the Spokane County Interstate Fair's Herdsmanship Contest is to encourage exhibitors to care for livestock, pens, and equipment...keeping stalls and animals clean and attractive at all times. Herdsmanship and Education Contest rules can be found at the beginning of the Exhibitor's Guide.
19. **FIRST HALF OTHER BREEDS TO INCLUDE –** Limousin, Brahman, Hereford, Lowline Percentage, and Lowline Full Blood.
20. **LOWLINE CATTLE –** Lowline Cattle are 100% Angus derived from champion Angus bloodlines. They are family friendly, highly marketable cattle know for heavy muscling, easy calving and easy handling. Their most notable trait is their superior grass conversion making them ideal for the natural and grass-raised beef markets. Because of these attributes and their smaller size, Lowlines offer a unique benefit to the smaller acreage farmer. **Lowline Cattle entries will be tied (not penned) this year.**

Washington State Veterinarian's Regulations

Individual Certificates of Veterinary Inspection and an import permit number (which may be a blanket permit number issued to individual fairs) are required for all Out-of-State animals for entry. They will not be required for animals that originate in the State of Washington. Health certificates must identify each individual animal. The Out-of-State exhibitor's permit number for the 2009 Fair is 91-C1434. Your veterinarian need not call the Washington State Department of Agriculture if they use this permit number on health certificates. A new number will be issued each year. No animal from a quarantined area or premises will be permitted to enter the Fair. Out-of-State entries must comply with the State of Washington import regulations. No exemptions unless exempted by rule. Out-of-state animals require a certificate of veterinary inspection, an entry permit number, a negative Tuberculosis test within 60 days of shipment and a negative Brucellosis test within 30 days of shipment. If cattle remain in the State, they must also meet Washington Brucellosis requirements. Any bull that will be sold during the fair requires a negative bovine Trichomoniasis culture test within 30 days before import or have a certifying statement that they are virgin bulls under 24 months of age and have had no breeding contact with female cattle. Any breed cattle over six months of age from the states of California, Michigan, Minnesota, and New Mexico and the countries of Canada and Mexico require a negative Tuberculosis test within 60 days of shipment. All cattle are required to have an ownership inspection (brand) prior to leaving the state of origin. The Fair Veterinarian **MUST AND WILL** reject any animal with infections or a contagious disease or ectoparasite, including but not limited to ringworm, warts, pinkeye, strangles, contagious ecthyma, scabies, lice, mites, ticks and fleas. Animals exhibiting disease symptoms during the course of the Fair will be rejected by the Fair veterinarian and removed from the exhibit area. It is strongly recommended, but not required, that cattle be vaccinated in the current show year against respiratory diseases. The Fair veterinarian's professional decision as to the health status of an animal will be upheld by Fair Management.

Round Robin Showmanship Contest (Department C-C Only)

The contest will be held Sunday, September 13, at 2:00 p.m. The top showman from the Beef, Sheep, Goat, and Swine Departments will be automatically entered in the Round Robin Showmanship contest. All contestants will enter the ring with his animal and proceed to show it for three to five minutes then move on to the next animal and show it for the allotted time. This will continue until each contestant has shown each type of animal.

Grooming and Showing (Department C-C Only)

Grooming and Showing will be scored based on the following: Preparation of showing (**35 percent**) including condition of feet, condition of coat (freedom from scurf and dirt), cleanliness and grooming, score will be lowered for excess oil and use of objectionable materials, and trimming of ears, tail, etc.; Showing the animal (**55 percent**) including appearance of exhibitor, control of animal by exhibitor, poise of exhibitor, and skills in showing, including continuous attention, keeping the animal placed to advantage, and the ability to stand or move animal as requested by the judge; and fleshing or condition / thickness / distribution and texture of flesh (**10 percent**). The purpose of the showmanship contest is to create more interest in, and better knowledge of, proper grooming, training and showing animals. All training and preparation of the animals, both prior to and during the show, is to be done by the contestants. Each contestant must show his own animal.

DEPARTMENT CLH / C-CLH (TEXAS LONGHORNS)

Longhorn Department limited to 70 head for the 2009 Show due to available space.

Both shows will use the standard TLBAA age / class numbers.

NRLA – NWLA SHOWS: These shows are being hosted by the Northern Rockies Longhorn and the Northwest Longhorn Associations. Both shows are World Qualifying Shows. Points accumulated by each animal at each show go towards earning Hall of Fame status for an animal. Hall of Fame status is based upon the total number of points won by an animal in a show year. Animals that place first or second in either of these shows are also qualified to participate in the Texas Longhorn Breeders Association of American (TBLAA) World Show in Ft. Worth, Texas. TLBAA World Qualifying Show rules apply. All entries must be at least 120 days old on the day of the show. Females may be shown with calf at side. Calves shown at side may not be more than 205 days old on the day of the show and may not be crossbred. Youth exhibitors must be under 18 years old as of January 1, 2009. Bulls are to be shown at halter with nose lead. Bulls without nose lead will be disqualified. Showmanship – all animals in Showmanship Classes must have been shown in TLBT Youth Show. No additional entry fees will be charged for participation in Showmanship Classes. Pee Wee Showmanship – exhibitors may show calves male or female and adults will be allowed in the show ring. Entries for the NRLA show are to be sent to Ben Myren. Entries for the NLA show are to be sent to Bob Larson. Entry deadline is August 11 – entries received after that date will be charged an additional \$10.00 / head / class late fee.

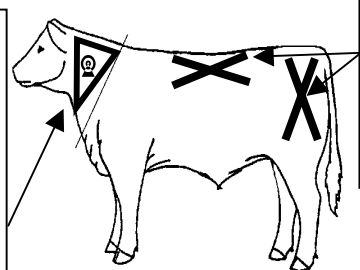
