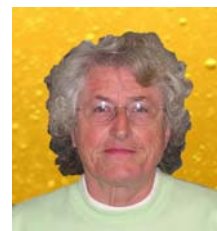

CRAFT DEPARTMENT RULES

1. **Exhibitor may enter only one exhibit per lot.**
2. Exhibitor is responsible to read "General Rules" at beginning of Exhibitor's Guide.
3. All exhibitors must use official entry forms and they must be postmarked on or before August 11, to Fair Entries, 404 N Havana Street Ste 1, Spokane Valley WA 99202-4663.
4. Items showing wear or soiled articles will be disqualified by the judge.
5. Exhibitors must present claim ticket when picking up their exhibit and must not remove exhibit unless superintendent or assistant is present to check out the exhibit. No exhibit shall be withdrawn before Monday, September 21.
6. The Fair is not responsible for hangers or bags left with articles.
7. Lamps or light fixtures must be provided with shade and bulb.
8. All pictures or wall hangings must be ready to hang. Hanger must support picture. Fair reserves the right to staple.
9. No sewing or stitchery in Department M (See Department J).
10. **Lego, snap model, and K-Necs projects will not be accepted.**
11. Judging will be based upon function, cleanliness, refinement of surface, technique – workmanship, suitability of design, consistency of surface to design, and composition.
12. Youth - Preformed models may be entered only as crafts, as determined by the superintendent. No models except in specified classes and must be glued. All articles shall be finished by painting, shellacking, mounting, or finished in an appropriate manner - whichever is appropriate and be of fair quality or they may not be accepted or displayed. If you are a disabled child, add a 3 x 5 card and state disability (please be specific). This information is for judge's use only.

All entries must be ready to hang but may be pinned or stapled. The photography must be an original and have been taken by the exhibitor in the last year. All photographs must be attached to poster board or matt board using dry mount tissue, rubber cement, or other adhesive. Gatorfoam can be used as a means of displaying photographs. Framed photographs cannot be accepted. Digital photos must be printed on photo quality paper. Photographs placed in matt board frames or in metal, wood, or other rigid frames, with or without glass or plexiglass, cannot be entered and will not be accepted. Mounted prints shall display at least a one-inch border. Each entry should be titled, preferably on the front of the display. Name of camera and lens, type of film, exposure, F stop and shutter speed, as well as special equipment used must be recorded on the back of each entry. Each lot will consist of a single print, not to exceed 8" x 10" in size, except for lot 5 and lot 12 which shall contain 2 to 6 standard sized prints. Digitally manipulated is surreal images created by a computer manipulation of scenes to combine several images or parts of images to create images that could not exist in real life.

DID YOU KNOW?

The Spokane County Fair and Expo Center makes an economic impact on the Spokane area of more than \$24,000,000 annually. This is from non-resident spending and is a result of hosting over 100 events annually including the Interstate Fair. The Interstate Fair generates over \$6,000,000 of the \$24,000,000 annually. For this study, a non-resident is defined as an attendee who resides 30+ miles from the Spokane County Fair and Expo Center.

PAPIER MACHE CONTEST

CHILDREN'S 6th ANNUAL

The Spokane County Interstate Fair invites children to participate in the sixth annual papier-mâché livestock show. This is an opportunity for children to create and to showcase their own animal. This is a wonderful way to get children involved in the Fair's activities and to learn about the animals. Plus it is a fun way to learn about recycling paper.

Getting Started:

1. Use Department MM, Class 5, Lot 36. Mail a completed entry form to the Fair on or before August 11. Entry forms should be mailed to Spokane County Interstate Fair, 404 N Havana St Ste 1, Spokane Valley WA 99202-4663.
2. Choose one of the 9 animals showcased at the Fair as a model for your papier-mâché project. They include Chicken, Cow, Goat, Horse, Pig, Pigeon, Rabbit, Sheep, or Turkey.
3. Crumple some newspaper to create the desired shape. Use masking tape to help the paper keep desired shape and to attach the different parts of the animal's body.
4. The animal that is submitted has a maximum size limit. Each animal can only be 24" tall (from feet to head), 18" long (from nose to tail), and 12" wide.
5. Bring the actual entry to the Interstate Fair (Bay 3) on Tuesday, September 8 between 8:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m.
6. Animals must be picked up on Monday, September 21, between **Noon and 6:00 p.m. in Bay 4**. Bay 4 is the location where the animals were displayed during the Fair. Animals remaining after Sept. 21 will be disposed of.

How to papier-mâché:

1. Tear newspaper into approximately 2" x 8" strips.
2. Dip strips of newspaper into cooled glue mixture.
3. Squeeze off excess glue with fingers.
4. Place strips one at a time over the mold and smooth out air bubbles.
5. Cover mold with 2-3 layers of paper strips at a time.
6. Allow these layers to dry before adding more. Note: The thicker the layers, the longer it will take to dry. For best drying results, place project in a warm area, outside in the breeze or near an electric fan.
7. You can apply as many layers as you like until you reach your desired thickness.

Glue Recipe:

Boil 5 cups of water in a saucepan. In a bowl, mix ¼ cup of flour with a cup of cold water. Mix until consistency is smooth. When completely free of lumps, add the mixture to the boiling water in the saucepan. Stir the mixture for two to three minutes, gently boiling until the mixture thickens. Allow mixture to cool before using.

Special Awards

Two tickets to the Fair will be given to Best in Show, Runner-Up in Show, and Most Creative. Premium points (Blue – 15 points, Red – 11 points, White – 7 points) will also be given.

Recycling Facts

Every day The Spokesman-Review is printed on recycled newsprint that contains 25% to 40% post-consumer waste. To help continue their efforts in recycling, recycle your newspaper after you read it each morning. Here are some ideas to help you reuse your daily paper.

- Newspaper is a great odor absorber. Stuff crumpled newspaper into your shoes or boots overnight to get rid of nasty foot odor. If your plastic containers smell bad, fill them with crumpled paper and seal overnight to remove the stink.
- Spreading flat or shredded newspaper around the base of, or between rows of, your outdoor plants and then giving everything a thorough watering will help discourage weed growth and act as garden mulch.
- After you clean your glass surfaces with paper towels and glass cleaner, use wadded-up newspaper for a final once-over. Bye-bye, streaks!
- Newspaper cut into even strips makes the perfect papier-mâché material – just ask the thousands of kids who have made papier-mâché animals for the Fair during the past five years.
