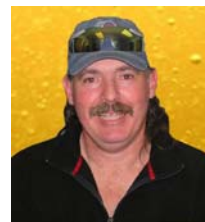

DAHLIA DEPARTMENT RULES

1. Exhibitors are responsible to read Floral Department General Rules at beginning of Floral Department as well as the Exhibitor General Rules found at the beginning of the Exhibitor's Guide.
2. List "Department ID Dahlias" on entry form only. Please, do NOT list individual classes until time of entry.
3. Please use a separate entry form for Department ID (Dahlias). Entry forms may be copied.
4. Exhibitor Classifications:

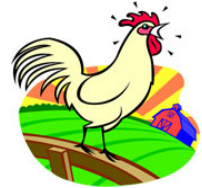
NON-MEMBER (YELLOW / GREEN TAGS): Anyone who is not a member of the I.E.D.S., P.N.D.C., or A.D.S. affiliated or participating society. Use yellow entry tags, lot numbers 1 through 95, and classes 1 through 38. Non-Members may enter one potted plant and one arrangement using the non-member yellow tags. These will not count for sweepstakes points. Youth and adult will be judged separately. Youth includes anyone through age 18. Best bloom in each will be awarded. All entries will be judged on the Danish system. After three (3) sweepstakes, adult exhibitors must join I.E.D.S. and enter Novice Class. Adult will use yellow tags. Youth will use green tags.

NOVICE (ORANGE TAGS): A member of a Dahlia Society who is inexperienced in the showing of dahlias. They may show as a Novice for a maximum of three years or may choose to advance after the first or second year.

AMATEUR (PINK TAGS): A member of a Dahlia Society who has exhibited as a Novice for a minimum of one year. They may remain in this division for a maximum of 5 years regardless of winnings or may choose to advance after one year.

OPEN (BLUE TAGS): Exhibitors who are Commercial growers or exhibitors who have exhibited as an Amateur for at least 1 year or have exhibited as an Amateur for a maximum of 5 years. Exhibitors who have not consistently won trophies and special awards during the immediate past three consecutive show seasons may return to the Amateur Class.

5. White tags used for classes 39 through 43, open to all classes except non-member. Will not count in sweepstakes points.
6. **Entry tags not fully filled out will disqualify the entry. Please use classification number after dahlia type.**
7. All dahlias must be exhibited in containers supplied by the show, except for the arrangement, bouquet, and basket classes. Special containers will be provided if needed. All baskets must have handles.
8. Artificial support for blooms above the container is prohibited.
9. Dahlias must be displayed with at least one set of leaves on the stem and disbudded except where otherwise noted.
10. All Dahlias shall be entered as classified in the latest ADS Classification Book; Northwest Supplemental section will govern in case of conflict.
11. Exhibits entered incorrectly will be disqualified. Disseminated dahlias when entered as classified into competition in ADS Shows will not be disqualified, nor will they receive premium/penalty points for being oversized/undersized. The dahlia bloom will be judged on its merits or lack of.
12. Exhibitors may not make more than one entry of the same variety in a class. Husband and wife must enter in the same class, whichever is higher.
13. Novice, Amateur, Open and Non-member will use lot numbers 1 through 95.
14. Named varieties only. Undisseminated dahlias may be entered in show against classified Dahlias for one year only.
15. The Show Committee reserves the right to reject any entry. The Show Committee may also make additions or changes in the rules which are deemed necessary for the proper conduct of the show. Any rules so made shall be as binding as though they were a published part of these rules (they may not alter the judge's decisions).
16. Only judges, show committee, and assigned personnel will be allowed on the floor during judging. Judges completing initial assignments will be asked to go to the back of the room for further instructions.
17. A second award may be given by judges when an entry is considered unworthy of a first award.
18. White tag entries do not score points for sweepstakes.
19. In case of a tie in points for sweepstakes, the exhibitor having the most blue ribbons shall be considered the winner. In case of a tie in blue ribbons, the winner then shall be the one having the least number of entries.
20. High score in novice, amateur, and open class will win sweepstakes within each class.
21. Non-member winners must have a minimum of ten (10) points to receive the sweepstakes award.
22. All blooms shown in competition, including blooms in baskets and bouquets, must have been grown by the exhibitor except for arrangements.
23. Exhibitors shall keep their exhibits fresh.
24. Lacinated Dahlias may also be shown in the appropriate class according to their size.



ENTRY TAG GUIDELINES

The exhibitor ALONE will be held responsible for correctly and completely filling out the entry tag. Fill out both the TOP and BOTTOM sections of the provided entry tags. Omissions or misidentifications could cause an exhibit not to be judged.

2. NAME OF DAHLIA AND CLASSIFICATION NUMBER – Refer to ADS Handbook.
3. CLASS NUMBER – Refer to Exhibitor's Guide.

DEPARTMENT ID CLASS 40 (DAHLIA ARRANGEMENTS)

1. Using the theme and classes as shown (traditional, mantle, hall, dining table, coffee table, etc.), arrangements may be entered in the class appropriate to the theme. All classes are interpretive and accessories are permitted where desired.
2. Use white tags.
3. An exhibitor may not have more than one entry in any lot, but may enter as many lots as desired.
4. The design must be the original work of, and placed by the exhibitor.
5. All containers and accessories should be marked inconspicuously with the owner's name. The owner is responsible for making arrangements to collect their containers.
6. Dahlias only must be used in all lots unless otherwise noted, they need not be grown by the exhibitor. Buds are allowed in this class.
7. All fresh plant material must be used. No artificial material permitted.
8. Same rules apply as previously for Sweepstake ties.
9. Add the following categories to your entry in front of the lot number. Entries not so marked will be disqualified.
 - B. Beginner - For anyone who has not won more than 5 blue ribbons.
 - I. Intermediate - For anyone who has won 6 and not more than 11 blue ribbons.
 - A. Advanced - For anyone who has won 12 or more blue ribbons or worked as a professional.

3. Categories: For Class 41, add B (Beginner), I (Intermediate), or A (Advanced) in front of the lot number. Use the same advancement definitions as found in Class 40 rules.

DEPARTMENT ID CLASS 42 (DAHLIA BASKETS)

1. Use White Tags for Lots 1 through 5.
2. Dahlia blooms for baskets must be grown and staged by the Exhibitor. Baskets must have handles.
3. Natural-fill in foliage with or without inconspicuous flowers and/or berries will be allowed. The first or lower blooms may be shown without the first pair of leaves.
4. Categories: For Class 42, add B (Beginner), I (Intermediate), or A (Advanced) in front of the lot number. Use the same advancement definitions as found in Class 40 rules.

GENERAL RULES

1. Should additional information be required, please contact Roy Barton at 558 East 1st – Colville WA 99114 / (509) 684-3322 or Lowell Dubbels at 230 Shiloh Drive – Colville WA 99114 / (509) 684-5407.
2. This show is open to everyone. No pre-registration or entry is required. **Entrants are asked to obtain an exhibitor number upon arrival.** Inland Empire Gladiolus Society members are happy to assist you in entering this show according to the following rules.
3. Exhibitors are responsible to read Floral Department General Rules at beginning of Floral Department.
4. List "Department IG Glads" on entry form only. Please, do NOT list individual classes until time of entry.
5. The exhibitor ALONE will be held responsible for correctly and completely filling out the entry tag. Fill out both the TOP and BOTTOM sections of the provided entry tags. Omissions or misidentifications could cause an exhibit not to be judged.
6. After judging begins, no entries may be moved nor entry tags changed, except by duly appointed judges or members of the Show Committee. The Judges decisions shall be final.
7. The Inland Empire Gladiolus Society (IEGS) and the Spokane County Interstate Fair assume no responsibility for breakage, loss or damage to the property of Exhibitors.
8. No flowers, ribbons or prized are to be removed. The Award Committee shall be in complete charge of removal of flowers, rosettes and trophies from the Awards table and will present same to winners.

GROUP 1 – HORTICULTURAL EXHIBITS

1. All entries in the Horticulture Divisions become the property of the Inland Empire Gladiolus Society. All gladiolus entered in these Divisions **must have been grown by the Exhibitor.**
2. Youth and Novice Exhibitors may enter single spikes in the Horticultural Group of the Youth/Novice Division or Open Division, but not in both. They may enter all other divisions either in the Youth/Novice and/or in the Open Division.
3. Youth Exhibitors who have won an IEGS Youth Championship may enter either the Youth/Novice or Open Division.
4. All other entries will be in the Open Division.
5. Exhibitors may make as many entries as they wish in Single Spike or Three Spike Divisions provided the entries are different varieties. Spouses who grow together may compete against each other in the show.
6. Basket, Vase and Patina Division entries are not limited per Exhibitor.
7. All varieties must be correctly labeled with the Name of the Cultivar. In the Youth/Novice Divisions unknown varieties must be labeled "unknown".
8. Blue ribbons, Rosettes and Trophies will be given only if entries are worthy. A second or third ribbon may be given where no entry is judged worthy of a first.
9. Containers will be furnished for all Single Spike, Three Spike and Vases entries.
10. The current year's North American Gladiolus Council (NAGC) Classification List will be used in placing all entries. The Show Committee has the right to divide or combine classes where they deem it advisable. Duly appointed judges shall have the option to move any entry before judging, if they feel it has been improperly placed. They may also make corrections of names or classification numbers on entry tags where these are in error.

11. Stems of gladiolus entered in Formal Spike competition will be judged by the standards in the latest NAGC Judges Handbook using the merit system.
12. In judging entries in the Decorative Division, Judges will use NAGC Decorative Guidelines.
13. Baskets, Vases and Patinas other foliage is permitted and the following rules apply.
Baskets: 16-30 spikes per basket.
Vases: 7-11 spikes per vase. (Uniform vases will be furnished.)
Patinas: Only small-flowered gladiolus (100 – 200 sizes) may be used, but any number of spikes is permitted. The container must not be more than 6 inches in height, and width must be greater than height. Arrangement may be fan-like, triangular, flatly circular, symmetrical, etc. and not more than 24 total inches in height.
14. Seedlings entered in Class 5 and 6 must have the name of the originator on the closed portion of the entry tag. Seedling number or name, size and color class must be shown on the tag. A score of 85 points or more is eligible for a blue ribbon and a score of 82 – 84 points is eligible for a red ribbon. Actual point scoring is not necessary on every seedling. Seedlings may not be entered in open single and three spike classes, which must be named varieties. Undisseminated mutations or "sports" are considered seedlings for show purposes. A seedling Champion will be selected from each of the Seedling Classes.
15. The Show Champion Single Spike is to be selected from the Large and Small Grand Champions within each of the Decorative and Exhibition Class, except seedlings.
16. The Grand Champion Single Spikes will consist of a Small Champion (100 and 200 size Section Champions) and a Large Champion (300, 400 and 500 size Section Champions) for both the Decorative and Exhibition Division, except seedlings.
17. The Reserve Champion Single Spike Champions are to be selected in the same manner as the Grand Champions, after the sections from which the Grand Champions have been re-judged and alternate Lot Champions chosen.
18. The Three Spike Champion and the Three Spike Reserve Champions will be chosen in a similar manner as are the Single Spike Champions.
19. The following Table of NAGC Floret size will determine the appropriate Lot for entry in the Horticultural Exhibits.

Rules for Floral Art:

1. Only one arrangement is allowed per person per class.
2. The Exhibitor must make all Artistic Arrangements.
3. The Exhibitor may use material available. The floral material does not need to be grown by the arranger.
4. Gladiolus must be predominant in arrangements. Other vegetative material may be used, but no artificial flowers or foliage. Accessories are acceptable as long as they pertain to Show Theme.
5. The Exhibitor, at the direction of a Staging Committee Member, will place all Artistic Arrangements for display.
6. Only the arranger may alter an arrangement once it is placed on display. The placement Chairperson or their designate reserves the right to move arrangement for better placement or spacing.
7. The Inland Empire Gladiolus Society nor the Spokane County Interstate Fair is responsible for loss or breakage.
8. Each design should contain a 3X5-legend card explaining how arrangement represents the class title.

The Judges will use the following criteria for judging Floral Arts Entries:

- 20% Conformance (schedule rule requirements)
- 42% Design (elements and principles)
- 12% Artistic Concept (selection and organization of materials)
- 10% Expression (interpretation of class title, does it tell a story)
- 16% Distinction (marked superiority)
