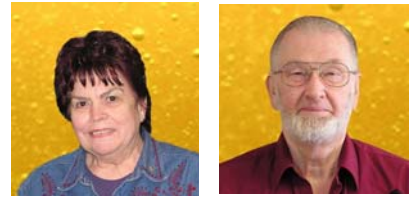


## FINE ARTS

### FINE ARTS DEPARTMENT RULES

1. Exhibitor is responsible to read "General Rules" at beginning of Exhibitor's Guide.
2. All exhibitors must use official entry forms and they must be postmarked on or before August 11, to Fair Entries, 404 N Havana Street Ste 1, Spokane Valley WA 99202-4663.
3. Exhibitors may enter a maximum of four (4) paintings, and/or (2) sculptures.
4. Exhibitors must be 12 years of age or older to enter in Fine Arts. Other youth art must be entered in Dept. M-M, Class 19.
5. Exhibitors must present claim ticket when picking up their exhibit and must not remove exhibit unless Superintendent or Assistant is present to check out the exhibit. No exhibit shall be withdrawn before Sunday, September 14 (see above release times). Exhibits not picked up by 8:00 p.m. on 09/21/09 will be disposed of.
6. All Fine Arts entries will be judged by the Danish System (the painting is judged on its own merit and will receive a Blue, Red, or White ribbon and constructive comments).
7. All paintings must be framed and have HOOK EYES AND WIRE for hanging. Saw-tooth hangers will not be accepted. Framing/matting will not be judged as part of the overall picture (exception Class 1 Professional Artists).
8. Maximum size of paintings must not exceed 36 inches in width or 36 inches in height INCLUDING FRAME. Minimum size of paintings is 7 inches by 7 inches including frame.
9. All sculptures must not exceed 2 feet in width, length, or height, and must be made out of clay or polymer clay. The use of slip molds or greenware available from ceramic or craft houses is not permitted.
10. Student Class – when not using original artwork, you must state who the original artist is and a notation will be made on your ID tag. Exception: Class 1 Professional Artist – this work must be original in concept and execution.
11. The Fair reserves the right to reject any work it finds objectionable.



### SPECIAL AWARDS

Best of Show will be awarded a trophy.  
 Best of Class will be awarded a rosette.  
 People's Choice (both adult and youth) will each receive a plaque.  
 Best Depiction of Fair Theme will be awarded a rosette.

### DEPARTMENT N CLASS 1 (PROFESSIONAL ARTIST)

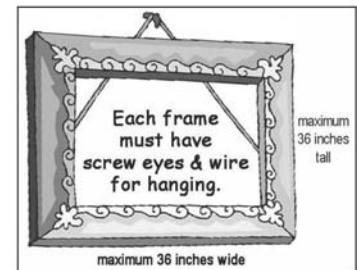
All work must be original in concept and execution. Use lots below.

### DEPARTMENT N CLASS 2 (NON-PROFESSIONAL ARTIST)

For the artist with extensive training and/or experience. This work may be original. If the work is not original, you must state who the artist is and that yours is a copy. Use lots below.

### DEPARTMENT N CLASS 3 (STUDENT)

For the artist still taking lessons. "Lessons" include TV shows, class work, and work done under instruction. If the work is not original, you must state who the artist is and that yours is a copy.
