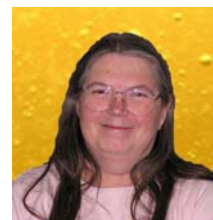

WINE DEPARTMENT RULES

1. Exhibitor is responsible to read "General Rules" as well as Department Rules.
2. All exhibitors must use official entry forms and they must be postmarked on or before August 11, to Fair Entries, 404 N Havana Street Ste 1, Spokane Valley WA 99202-4663.
3. Open to amateur wine makers. To be eligible, wines must be made at home and in fifths (750 ml) only in traditional type bottles w/ corks or screw tops except dessert wine that can be bottled in 1/2 bottles (375 ml).
4. Information on each wine entry should be type of wine, amount of batch being made, ingredients (including pounds of fruit, type and amount of sugar), starting specific gravity reading, type of yeast, additional additives, date started, date bottled, specific gravity reading at bottling time. Submit two bottles for each entry, one for judging and one for display, including an extra cork.
5. Care should be taken to enter wines in the proper categories.
6. After Monday, September 21, any exhibitors who have not come for their entries shall forfeit ribbons and exhibits that shall be disposed of at the discretion of the management.
7. Superintendents shall be in full charge of the department to which they are assigned
8. Exhibitors must present claim ticket when picking up their exhibit and must not remove exhibit unless superintendent or assistant is present to check out the exhibit. No exhibit shall be withdrawn before Monday, September 21.

Special Awards

Rosette for 1st, 2nd, 3rd place in each class.

Best of Lot and Participation will NOT receive extra premium monies.

The Interstate Fair will award a trophy for Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Wine

ALL CLASSES / LOTS:

Blue – 50 points

Red – 37 points

White – 25 points

DEPARTMENT R CLASS 1 (BERRY WINES) LOTS

All types of berries allowed.

LOT

1 Single variety – contains one berry type

LOT

2 Mixed variety - using more than one type of berry

LOT

DEPARTMENT R CLASS 2 (STONE FRUIT WINES) LOTS

Such as cherries, plums, peaches, and apricots.

LOT

1 Single variety – contains one stone fruit

LOT

2 Mixed variety – contains more than one type of stone fruit

LOT

DEPARTMENT R CLASS 3 (POME FRUIT WINES) LOTS

Such as Asian pear, apples, pears, crabapples, etc.

LOT

1 Apple – any variety or mixed varieties of apples

LOT

2 Apple or Pear – alcohol content should be less than 10%

LOT

3 Pear – any variety or mixed varieties of pears

Such as dandelion, rose petal, elderflower, lilac blossom, etc.
