Visiting Rules and Regulations

1. Government issued picture I.D. required by visitors 18 years of age or older.
2. **All visitors may be subject to search.** Refusal will result in the denial or termination of a visit.
3. Visitors may not enter the facility if they are under the influence of intoxicants or illegal drugs.
4. Visitors may bring only the following items into the facility:
 - a. Identification;
 - b. Car keys;
 - c. One sealed, un-opened pack of cigarettes;
 - d. Diapers, baby bottle, prepackaged baby food and blanket for infants;
 - e. Change not to exceed \$5.00 in coins per visitor;
 - f. Briefcase (visits from attorneys only)
5. Inmates will be allowed to bring only their ID tags with them to the Visiting Center.
6. The Visiting Center capacity is limited to eighty (80) people including staff, inmates, visitors, and their children. Visiting will be conducted on a first come, first serve basis. Visiting sessions will be provided for both contact visitation (A Bldg) and non-contact visitation (B Bldg) throughout the week. Visiting times will be posted on inmates' bulletin boards, outside the Visiting Center, and in the Control Rooms for staff to reference. Holiday visiting schedule will be posted in advance. Visiting sessions may be canceled only with the approval of the Captain/Jail Commander, Custody Lieutenant or Designee.
7. Visitors may not give to an inmate, leave at control, or ask staff to accept **any** item including money. Inmates and visitors cannot exchange anything during visits.
8. Visitors must wear the issued I.D. tag in the upper chest area at all times.
9. All food and drink items must be consumed in the visiting area. Food and drink items cannot be taken back to inmate's rooms.
10. All vending machine purchases must be made by the visitor. Inmates may not use the vending machines.
11. Contact Visiting - Only five (5) visitors may visit an inmate at one time to include adults **and** minors seventeen years of age or younger.
Non-contact visiting - Only three (3) visitors may visit an inmate at one time including minors.
12. Inmates must be properly dressed:
 - a. Shoes (no shower shoes) must be worn in the visiting room and outside at all times during visitation.
 - b. Clothes shall be clean, in good repair and appropriately worn.
 - c. No hats will be allowed.
13. Visitors will be properly dressed. Visitors will not wear suggestive attire such as see-through clothing, halter tops, tank tops, excessively short dresses, or shorts. Females are required to wear under clothing. Shoes must be worn at all times during the visit.
14. The following behavior will apply to inmates and their visitors during contact visiting:
 - a. Inmates and visitors may embrace and kiss **once at the beginning** and **once at the end** of the visiting period.
 - b. Inmates and visitors may place arms on each other's shoulders and waist, but may not put legs over one another during visiting.

- c. Inmates and visitors can sit side by side at the tables or across from one another. Neither the inmate nor the visitor are allowed to straddle the chairs or benches in order to face each other.
 - d. Inmates and visitors may hold hands above the table and visible to staff.
 - e. Arguments will not be tolerated between inmates and visitors.
 - e. Inmates and visitors will not spank or otherwise inappropriately reprimand children.
 - g. Inmates and visitors must behave in a manner consistent with Geiger Corrections Center's standards.
15. Inmates may leave the visiting room only to move to an authorized outside area, or to attend pill line. Leaving the Visiting Center for any other reason will be considered a termination of the visit, unless authorized by the on-duty Corrections Sergeant.
 16. After their visit has ended, the inmate must remain in the Visiting Center until permission is given by the Visiting Deputy to leave.
 17. Inmates will be responsible for their visitor's actions. Children must be supervised and controlled.
 18. Inmates and visitors will remain in full view of the Visiting Deputy at all times.
 19. Furniture will be used only for its intended purpose. Feet cannot be placed on chairs or tables. No lying on furniture, picnic tables or the ground.
 20. Inmate restrooms will remain locked during visiting. Inmates are instructed to use the restrooms in their living area prior to visiting. Inmate access to the restroom is limited and can be authorized only by the on-duty Sergeant and/or Visiting Deputy.
 21. Any violation of the above visiting rules could result in the termination of the visit and/or an Incident Report/Infraction Report written for the inmate.
