

Decision Making Agreement for the WRIA 54/57 Instream Flow Work Group.

Decision making framework

In developing tentative decisions on instream flow Work Group recommendations, members will:

1. Try to reach consensus;
2. If consensus cannot be reached, continue work to see if acceptable changes can be made to reach consensus;
3. If this is not possible, then the Work Group will conduct a vote and tally the votes. These votes, with names or organizations attached, will be included in a final report to the Planning Units; and
4. Allow for majority-minority perspectives based on the vote tally so that members from the WRIA 55/57 and 54 Planning Units can understand the rationale for the decisions made.

Who can vote?

Eligibility for voting will be determined according to the original list of volunteers that agreed to be part of the WRIA 54/57 instream flow Work Group.

If more than one representative from a participating entity (e.g., business, non-profit, association, tribe, county, or state) is voting (e.g., two individuals from Spokane County), their votes will be tallied as one vote. In other words, each representative entity has one vote.
