What might be even more important than Recycling?
While you are **Recycling** -- take action steps to:
Reduce = make less garbage in the first place.
Reuse = use something again for a different purpose.

Recycling is the natural thing to do! Get Involved!

Recycling is all about keeping resources in the loop – a natural resource (like a tree) is first used to make paper for magazines, art work or school work. Then when you recycle that paper, it becomes a resource to make a new piece of paper or another useful product. The same process works for bottles and cans and a whole lot more. Recycling helps conserve our natural resources and protect the environment. Recycling reduces air pollution and water pollution, and the amount of trees that are cut from our forests.

Recycling is the easiest thing we all can do every day to save energy, conserve natural resources and create green jobs. Recycling also avoids greenhouse gas emissions – reducing our carbon footprint.




