

ORDINANCE NO. 426

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF SPANGLE, WASHINGTON, PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION TO THE VOTERS OF THE TOWN OF SPANGLE AT A GENERAL ELECTION TO BE HELD THEREIN ON NOVEMBER 7th, 2017, OF A PROPOSITION AS TO WHETHER A SPECIAL EXCESS LEVY ON REAL PROPERTY SHALL BE AUTHORIZED TO PROVIDE \$17,000.00 IN 2018 FOR POLICE PROTECTION SERVICES TO THE TOWN VIA A POLICE PROTECTION SERVICES CONTRACT WITH SPOKANE COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE.

WHEREAS, the General Fund of the Town of Spangle is inadequate to pay the cost of a Police Services Contract with Spokane County Sheriff's Office for the year 2018;

WHEREAS, no other funds, grants, or loans are available to defray the cost of a Police Protection Services Contract with Spokane County Sheriff's Office for the year 2018;

WHEREAS, to adequately protect the Town of Spangle, its citizens and provide adequate Police Protection Services and the funds for such police protection services must come from a source other than the General Fund of the Town of Spangle; and,

WHEREAS IT IS NECESSARY AND DESIRABLE TO RAISE THE NEEDED FUNDS BY AN EXCESS LEVY IF APPROVED BY THE VOTERS OF THE Town of Spangle at the election to be held on November 7th, 2017, and if passed, levied in 2017, for collection in 2018

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF SPANGLE AS FOLLOWING

Section I

That the following proposition be placed on the ballot of the General Election to be held in the Town of Spangle on November 7th, 2017, to wit:

PROPOSITION NO. 2

TOWN OF SPANGLE

POLICE PROTECTION SERVICE EXCESS LEVY

The Spangle Town Council enacted Ordinance NO. 426 concerning a proposition to finance the 2018 Police Protection Services. This proposition would authorize the Town to levy an excess property tax in 2018 on all taxable property with the Town of Spangle in an approximate rate of \$1.19 per \$1,000 of assessed value to raise \$17,000.00 to be used to provide adequate police protection services in 2018. Should this proposition be approved?

Section II

The Town Clerk is authorized and directed to present a certified copy of this Ordinance to the Spokane County Auditor no later than August 1st, 2017, 99 days before the November 7th, 2017 General Election; to request the Spokane County Auditor find that an emergency exists; to call a special election in the Town of Spangle on

November 7th, 2017, and to submit the ballot proposition set forth above to the qualified electors of the Town of Spangle at the election; and, to take all actions and do all things necessary to cause the ballot proposition described above to be submitted properly to the qualified electors of the Town of Spangle at the November 7th, 2017, General Election.

THE DEADLINE for submission of ballot propositions to the Spokane County Auditor requires this Ordinance to be enacted and submitted no later than August 1st, 2017. Therefore, an emergency exists. This Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon passage.
