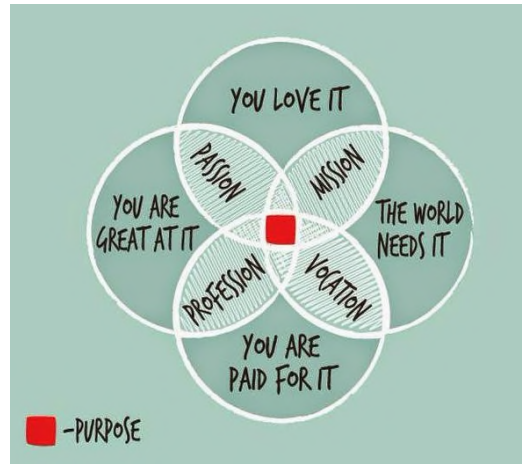

## WHAT IS SCHOOL TO WORK?

School To Work is a collaboration between the Developmental Disabilities Division of Spokane County, the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation (DVR), school districts, job support agencies and the Developmental Disabilities Administration (DDA). The purpose is to help students with developmental disabilities, in their last year of school, find jobs before they graduate; because students who have jobs when they graduate are more prepared for adult life than those who do not.

## WHAT DOES SCHOOL TO WORK DO?

- Connect students with intellectual and developmental disabilities to employment services while they are still in their high school transition programs.
- Assist students navigate the social service systems and obtain paid employment prior to exiting high school transition programs.
- Provide support from an employment support agency to assist in obtaining and maintaining a job.
