



Instructions

Marking Your Ballot



Completely fill in the oval to the left of your choice.
 Use a dark pen.
 Unless specifically allowed by law, more than one vote for a ballot measure will be an overvote and no votes for that office or ballot measure will be counted.

Correcting Your Ballot



If you make a correction, draw a line through the entire response. You then have the option of making another choice if you wish.

In order for your ballot to be counted, it must be either postmarked or deposited at a designated deposit site no later than 8:00 p.m. on Election Day (February 12, 2019). A list of Ballot Drop Box locations may be found at www.spokanecounty.org/elections.

 City of Spokane**

Levy for Hiring of Police and Fire Personnel, Funding Crime Reduction Programs and Exempting Eligible Senior Citizens and Persons with Disabilities from Collection

The City of Spokane adopted Resolution No. 2018 – 0103, approving a proposition to increase the regular property tax levy in excess of state law beginning in 2020, allocated 100% to police and fire personnel and crime reduction programming, establishing the basis for all subsequent levies and exempting all eligible persons under RCW 84.36.381. This proposition authorizes a property tax levy lid lift commencing in 2020 for \$0.30 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation, for a levy rate not to exceed \$3.60, all as provided in the resolution.

**Proposition No. 1
 Orchard Prairie School District No. 123**

Replacement Education Programs and Operations Levy

The Board of Directors of Orchard Prairie School District No. 123 adopted Resolution No. 18-03, concerning a proposition to finance educational programs and operational expenses. This proposition would authorize the District to levy the following excess taxes, in place of an expiring levy, upon all taxable property within the District, for support of the District's educational programs and operation expenses not funded by the State:

<u>Collection Year</u>	<u>Estimated Levy Rate/\$1,000 Assessed Value</u>	<u>Levy Amount</u>
2020	\$1.17	\$125,000
2021	\$1.14	\$125,000

all as provided in Resolution No. 18-03 and subject to legal limits on levy rates and amounts at the time of levy. Should this proposition be approved?

 Spokane Valley Fire Department**

Replacement Maintenance and Operation Levy

The Board of Fire Commissioners of Spokane Valley Fire Department adopted Resolution No. 2018-458 concerning a proposition to meet District maintenance and operation needs. This proposition would authorize the District to levy the following taxes, in replacement of an existing levy, upon all taxable property within the District, for support of the District's Expense Fund maintenance and operation expenditures as follows:

<u>Levy Year</u>	<u>Collection Year</u>	<u>Levy Rate*</u>	<u>Levy Amount</u>
2019	2020	\$1.90	\$26,150,000
2020	2021	\$1.90	\$27,500,000
2021	2022	\$1.97	\$30,000,000

Spokane County Fire Protection District No. 8

Replacement Maintenance and Operation Levy

The Board of Spokane County Fire Protection District No. 8 adopted Resolution 18-09 concerning a proposition to finance maintenance and operation costs. This proposition, would authorize the levy of the excess taxes, in replacement of an existing levy, specified below as authorized by RCW 84.52.130, to provide the funding necessary to maintain the level of fire protection and emergency medical services within the District.

Proposition No. 1
Spokane County Fire Protection District No. 13 (Newman Lake Fire & Rescue)

Replacement Emergency Medical Services Levy

The Board of Fire Commissioners of Spokane County Fire Protection District No. 13 (Newman Lake Fire & Rescue) adopted Resolution 2018-6 concerning a proposition to continue its Emergency Medical Services property tax levy. This proposition would authorize the Board of Fire Commissioners to continue funding Emergency Medical Services for its citizens and replace the expiring EMS levy to maintain the \$.50 per \$1,000.00 of assessed valuation for a period of six consecutive years, collection to begin in 2020.

In order for your ballot to be counted, it must be either postmarked or deposited at a designated deposit site no later than 8:00 p.m. on Election Day (February 12, 2019). If depositing your ballot in a US Postal Service box, postage is prepaid.

The Elections Office is open from 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. weekdays to answer questions; get replacement ballots; use an Accessible Voting Unit, or receive other assistance as needed.
