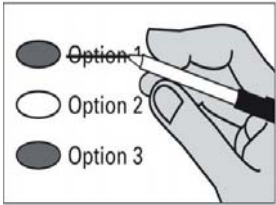
Completely fill in the oval to the left of your choice.

State Law Authorizes voters to approve the imposition of a one-tenth of one percent county-wide sales and use tax, the proceeds to be used by Spokane County and the Cities and Towns therein exclusively for Criminal Justice and Public Safety Purposes.

Should the Board of County Commissioners of Spokane County, as authorized by RCW 82.14.450, renew the imposition of a one-tenth of one percent county-wide sales and use tax, commencing April 1, 2020 and terminating December 31, 2029, the proceeds to be used by Spokane County and the Cities and Towns therein exclusively for Criminal Justice and Public Safety Purposes?

Regular Library Operations and Maintenance Levy

The Spokane County Library District Board of Trustees adopted Resolution No. 19-04 concerning a proposition to increase its regular property tax levy to provide continued funding for normal operation and maintenance of eleven community libraries and library services.

This proposition would authorize the district to restore its regular property tax levy rate to \$0.50 per \$1,000 of assessed value in 2019 for collection in 2020, as authorized by Chapter 84.55 RCW. Thereafter, such levy amount would be used to compute limitations for subsequent year levies as authorized by Chapter 84.55 RCW.

Spokane County Fire Protection District No. 3
Property Tax Levy for Fire Protection and Emergency Medical Services

The Board of Spokane County Fire Protection District No. 3 adopted Resolution No. 19-2 concerning a proposition to maintain and adequately fund District operations. This proposition authorizes the District to restore its regular property tax levy to \$1.50 per \$1,000 of assessed value to be assessed in 2019 and collected in 2020. The funds will maintain and improve fire protection, emergency medical services and facilities, replace apparatus and equipment, and provide for firefighter safety. The maximum allowable levy in 2019 shall serve as the base for subsequent levy limitations as provided by chapter 84.55 RCW. Shall this proposition be:

Fire Department Improvement Levy

The Board of Fire Commissioners of Spokane County Fire Protection District No. 5, adopted Resolution No. 1 concerning a proposition to finance Fire Department Improvements. This proposition would authorize District No. 5 to acquire new and improve existing firefighting and lifesaving apparatus, vehicles and equipment, construct new fire station(s) and facilities and acquire land for future fire stations. This measure authorizes an increase in the regular property tax levy of \$0.46 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation for a levy rate not to exceed \$1.48 collected in 2020. The increase in property tax levy would remain in effect for a period of fifteen years.
