

The Street Medicine program is a collaboration between the WSU Elson S Floyd College of Medicine, SRHD, CHAS, SNAP, Jewels Helping Hands, Volunteers of America, and Catholic Charities.

Street Medicine is a program set up to provide care to the homeless population where they are and facilitate the connection between homeless service organizations and healthcare.

Street medicine teams consist of a homeless outreach worker, clinician, and SRHD staff/volunteer. The Street teams currently work M,W,F 9-12 and 4-7 as well as Sat 2-5. The team is based out of the CHAS Denny Murphy clinic.

Currently street medicine teams can provide

- screening and testing for COVID-19
- Acute medical care
- Hep A vaccination
- HIV and Syphilis rapid testing
- Follow up appointments with CHAS, HOC clinic and STHC

We are hoping to expand street medicine to be available all week and serve as the point of contact for homeless service organizations that have clients with medical needs.
