We ask, in advance, for your patience and understanding. We've had to make a lot of changes based on floor space available and number of employees able to assist us this year while making sure to be good stewards of our funds to guarantee a 2022 Interstate Fair that is even bigger and better than our accomplishment this year. Again, thank you! Below is a list of this year's changes to the Floral Department. We'll see you in September!

1. Exhibits may arrive from 9:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. on THURSDAY, September 9 (this is a date and time change).
2. Each exhibitor may enter a maximum of fifteen (15) exhibits from the Floral Department this year due to reduced available display space.
3. **NEW** - Exhibitors are requested to pick up entry tags and complete them prior to September 9.
4. Many of the lots have changed this year. Please be sure to use the 2021 Exhibitor's Guide rather than a previous year's edition.
5. Judging will be held on FRIDAY, September 10 at 8:00 a.m. (date change).
6. The building will be shared with the following departments this year – Floral, Fine Arts, Dahlias, Grange Booths, Horticulture, and other Agricultural Displays.

*On behalf of the Spokane County Fair and Expo Center Advisory Board, I would like to thank you for being a part of the 2021 Spokane County Interstate Fair. What a roller coaster the last year has been! With COVID, we were able to offer a modified virtual competition for many traditional fair departments in 2020 and we want to thank those that participated in last year's event. ## FLORAL DEPARTMENT INFORMATION

**COMPLETING ENTRY FORMS:** All exhibitors must use entry form found at the end of the book and entry forms must be postmarked on or before August 10, to Fair Entries, 404 N Havana Street Ste 1, Spokane Valley WA 99202-4663. Particular care should be given in the preparation of all entry forms. Full and correct information must be given. Staff will be available in Bay 2 from 4:00 to 7:00 p.m. on August 10 to assist you with your entry form if needed.

**ARRIVING AT THE FAIR:** Please take exhibits to the south door in between Bays 3 and 4 accessible from the South Gate on Havana Street. Exhibitor should arrive with completed entry tags (available at the Fair Office, Monday through Friday 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.). Complete tags in full or no award can be given. Staff will use the bottom of the entry tag. Please try to include name of plants and flowers if possible as this helps to inform the public.

**PASSES / TICKETS:** Care of the floral exhibits will be the responsibility of the Floral Superintendents during the operating days of the Fair, thus passes and tickets will not be distributed to exhibitors. Exhibitors are encouraged to purchase discounted tickets at the Fair Office beginning mid-June and running through September 9.

**EXHIBITING AT THE FAIR:** The Department Superintendent and/or Fair Coordinator may exclude an exhibit from being exhibited at the Fair if it is not properly prepared. Each exhibit shall be placed according to the decision of the judge and such placing shall be final. Anyone interfering with a judge will forfeit the right of prize money. Any protest regarding the judging shall be made in writing and must be accompanied by a \$25.00 deposit. Such protest must state plainly the cause of the complaint or appeal and must be filed with the Fair Office within 24 hours after the cause of the protest. If the Fair sustains the appeal, the fee will be refunded. The Fair reserves the right to cancel or combine classes/lots as needed, as well as substitute judges. Classes/lots may be combined or cancelled due to number of entries. If there is no competition in a class/lot for two years, the class/lot may be dropped.

**EXHIBITING AT THE FAIR (Additional Youth Information):** Youth exhibitors must not be under 5 years of age nor over 18 years of age as of 01/01/21. Awards in all classes/lots will be made on a point system, listed for each exhibit. The money per point will be the same for all exhibits and will be calculated by dividing all prize money by the total points awarded.

**FURTHER INFORMATION:** The following information is provided to further clarify.

- This year's theme for the show is "**More Fun in '21**".
- Exhibitors may make only one entry per lot except where noted.
- **Exhibitors must list color classification on their entry tags when entering their flowers. The color classification for all flowers is White (A), Pink (B), Yellow (C), Red (D), Purple (E), Blue (F), Orange (G), Magenta (H), Gold (I), Lavender (J), and Multi-colored / Variegated (K).**
- Flowers and plants must be grown by exhibitor (unless noted). Flowers in the arrangement section do not have to be grown by the exhibitor.
- Containers for the floral section will be furnished, unless otherwise noted. Exhibitors must use their own baskets in the basket section. All baskets must have handles. All potted plants must have drainage saucers.
- Any exhibit arriving at the Fair in a wilted, damaged, or unclean condition will not be accepted for competition, nor used in an exhibit.
- Wherever the schedule calls for a certain number of blooms or sprays, please exhibit that number. The judges adhere strictly to the schedule.
- Attached foliage must accompany bloom entries in order to show flower as grown. Exception is made where bloom has no foliage.
- The Fair will exercise all possible care of exhibits and containers but will not assume any responsibility for loss or damage.
- All classes will be judged under the Danish system and based on a 100% scale. Therefore, any entry that merits a blue (90% or higher), red (89-80%), or white ribbon (79% or under) will be awarded that placing.

- Judging will be based upon the following:
  - Bouquets - Arrangement, harmony and effectiveness (40%), Color and form of flowers (35%), Stem and foliage (20%), and Finish / neatness in workmanship (5%).
  - Containers and Baskets with Handles - Arrangement, harmony and effectiveness (40%), Color and form of flowers (35%), Stem and foliage (20%), and Finish / neatness in workmanship (5%).
  - Cut Flowers (Exclusive of Bouquets and Baskets) - Color (30%), Stem and Foliage (30%), Form (20%), Size for variety type (20%).
  - Potted Plants (Flowering) - Cultural Perfection (35%), Flower (25%), Foliage (25%), and Color (15%).
  - Potted Plants (Foliage) - Cultural Perfection (35%), Foliage (50%), and Color (15%).
  - Roses - Form (25%), Color (20%), Substance (15%), Stem / Foliage (20%), Size (10%), and Balance and Proportion (10%).
- Additional hints for horticulture and artistic divisions
  - Cut your flowers in late afternoon of the day before they are to be exhibited, placing the flowers immediately in water that has been out in the garden all day. Then mist and set the flowers in a cool, dark place without drafts. This allows the flowers to last much longer.
  - Cut stems cleanly, at an angle under water. Flowers should be kept in water overnight. All foliage that is below the water line should be removed. Foliage should be clean. Any broken or disfigured foliage or petals should be removed. Cut stems as long as possible. Foliage and stems count in judging as well as blooms. It is better to have more stem and foliage than too little. Groom plants well. Flowers must have their own attached foliage. All stems should be in proportion to the flower.
  - All containers should be clean.
  - All specimens should be named.

**RELEASE OF EXHIBITS:** Please pickup exhibits in Bay 4. Exhibitors must present claim ticket when picking up their exhibit and must not remove exhibit unless superintendent or assistant is present to check out the exhibit. No exhibit shall be withdrawn before Monday, September 21. If you have not left the office a self-addressed, stamped envelope for your prize money check and would like us to mail your check to you, you may leave the envelope with the department clerk upon picking up your exhibits.

**PRIZE MONEY:** Only exhibits listed in the Exhibitor's Guide will be accepted for prize money awards. For prize money, judge may or may not award all placings according to their discretion. Awards will be based on judges' records. Ribbons and tags shall not be considered proof for payment of prize money awards. Prize money will be forfeited by exhibitors failing to adhere to the release times printed in the Exhibitor's Guide. Checks may be picked up at the Fair Office between October 15 and 31 (Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.). Checks remaining after October 31 and/or checks not cashed by November 30 will become forfeited and considered a donation to the SCF&EC. To clarify, the checks will not be considered "abandoned" property under Chapter 63.29 RCW, but will be a donation by the payee to the SCF&EC. Prize money checks will NOT be issued or re-issued after November 30. If you are unable to pick up your check, you may mail the office a self addressed, stamped envelope with a request for us to mail your check. Prize money will be paid according to the following point system:

**SUPERINTENDENT:** Superintendent shall be in full charge of the department to which assigned and shall administer all policies pertaining to the respective department. Superintendent shall have charge of the entries, judge's sheets, and award sheets and shall be responsible for their being filled out correctly and returned to the Fair Office. Superintendent has authority to exclude exhibits not meeting quality standards. Any protest regarding the duties of Superintendents, MUST be made to the Fair Coordinator.

**ADDITIONAL FAIR INFORMATION:** No person will be permitted to distribute advertising matter upon the grounds except from their place of business or exhibit space. No person shall distribute advertising matter upon the grounds, including, "For Sale" signs without Superintendent Approval. The distribution of handbills, fliers, and heralds will not, under any circumstances, be permitted. Anyone violating this rule is subject to fine or expulsion from the grounds. Begging, soliciting, singing, and/or public speaking are prohibited. All concession space will be sold by the management and application must be made in writing. Under no circumstances will anyone be permitted to operate a concession without a signed agreement. 24-hour guard service is provided during the Fair. The Fair will use every precaution for safe preservation of entries on exhibit, but will not be responsible for loss or damage. Spokane County Sheriff supervises police protection. Spokane Valley Fire Department supervises fire protection. Only seeing-eye dogs or dogs participating in an approved demonstration or commercial booth will be allowed on the grounds. Service animals trained for a specific service to aid the person they are accompanying will be allowed on the grounds. Companion animals will not be permitted. Smoking in the buildings and barns is prohibited. Alcoholic beverages are prohibited on the grounds except in the Beer Garden.

**CLASS 37 / LOT 1 – GARDENER OF THE YEAR**

The exhibit shall consist of five different flower types in five vases with three blooms or three sprays of the same type and color in each vase. No two vases will contain blooms of the same type. Please name flowers. Vases provided by the Fair will be used. One exhibit per person. Flowers must be grown and staged by the exhibitor. Exhibits will be judged on uniformity in each vase, color, form and size for each type, stem and foliage, freshness and vigor, staging and overall display.

**Additional notes for Classes 38-43:** Flowers in this Department do not have to be grown by the exhibitor. The term "Plant Material" is defined as anything that is, or was once, live vegetation, (e.g., cones, berries, pods, grasses, grains, decorative woods, branches, dried flowers, fungus growth, treated, or colored plant material). No artificial / silk material permitted. Use the theme and classes as shown. Traditional arrangements may be entered in the class appropriate to the theme. All classes are interpretive and accessories are permitted where desired. The Fair will exercise all possible care of exhibits and containers but will not assume responsibility for loss or damage. A Best of Class ribbon will be awarded in each class. **Exhibitor must have name and address attached to the bottom of containers.**

"Professional" is defined as any person who has ever worked as a flower arranger and/or accepted payments for flower arrangements, for a person who maintains a garden or other horticulture establishment for the purpose of returning them a profit. A small business card may be placed by the arrangement. The Floral Superintendent will attach the card to the displays. All exhibits must be made and placed by the exhibitor.
