On March 23, 2020, the United States Department of Homeland Security’s Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Region 10 approved the Spokane County Hazard Mitigation Plan as a multi-jurisdictional local plan as outlined in Code of Federal Regulations Title 44 Part 201. This approval provides the below jurisdictions eligibility to apply for the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act’s, Hazard Mitigation Assistance grants through March 22, 2025, through your state.
