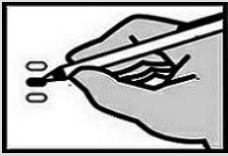
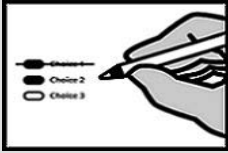


Sample Ballot

Proposition Restoring Property Tax Levy for Fire Protection and Emergency Medical Services

The Board of Spokane County Fire Protection District No. 8 adopted Resolution No. 21-03 concerning a proposition to maintain and adequately fund District operations.

This proposition authorizes the District to restore its regular property tax levy to \$1.50 per \$1,000 of assessed value in 2021 and authorizes adjustments by the greater of 1% or the annual U.S. City average unadjusted, all items index, west city class B/C, for the CPI-W reported each June for the five succeeding years. The maximum allowable levy in 2026 shall serve as the base for subsequent levy limitations consistent with chapter 84.55 RCW.
