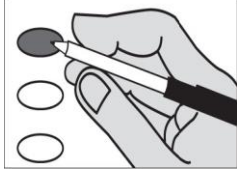


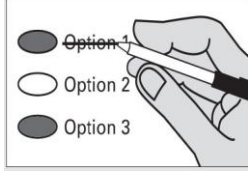
Instructions

Marking Your Ballot



Completely fill in the oval to the left of your choice.
Use a dark pen.
Unless specifically allowed by law, more than one vote for an office or ballot measure will be an overvote and no votes for that office or ballot measure will be counted. Vote for one candidate per office. To vote for a candidate whose name is not printed on the ballot, write the candidates name on the line provided and fill in the oval.

Correcting Your Ballot



If you make a correction, draw a line through the entire response. You then have the option of making another choice if you wish.
In order for your ballot to be counted, it must be either postmarked or deposited at a designated deposit site no later than 8:00 p.m. on Election Day (August 4, 2015).

READ: Each candidate for partisan office may state a political party that he or she prefers. A candidate's preference does not imply that the candidate is nominated or endorsed by the party, or that the party approves of or associates with that candidate.

Spokane Valley Library Capital Facility Area
Spokane County, Washington
General Obligation Bonds \$22,000,000

The Board of County Commissioners of Spokane County, Washington, adopted Resolution No. 15-0219, concerning a proposition to finance new and expanded libraries. This proposition would authorize the construction of a new Spokane Valley Library, new Veradale/Greenacres Library, the repurposing of the existing Spokane Valley Library and the expansion of the Argonne Library in order to increase the available library services; issue general obligation bonds maturing over 20 years in the amount of \$22,000,000; and levy annual excess property taxes to pay such bonds, as provided in Resolution No. 15-0219. Spokane County Fire Protection District No. 8
Maintenance and Operation Levy

The Board of Spokane County Fire Protection District No. 8 adopted Resolution 15-04 concerning a proposition to finance maintenance and operation costs.

This proposition, would authorize the levy and collection of the excess taxes specified below as authorized by RCW 84.52.130, to provide the funding necessary to (1) maintain the level of fire protection and emergency medical services within the District, and (2) increase response reliability through additional staffing including staffing each fire station with a paramedic/firefighter.
