Project Name: Spokane County Brooks Rd Reconstruction

Description of proposal: Spokane County Public Works is proposing to reconstruct a portion of Brooks Rd. The road will be widened from 28' to 36' with two 12' lanes and 6' shoulders. A 10' diameter culvert south of Hallet Rd will be extended on both ends to accommodate the wider road. Guardrail, signing, striping, driveway approach construction will also be included.

Location of proposal: The project begins at the Medical Lake City Limits and continues north to 600' north of Thorpe Rd. Section 36 T25N R40E, Sections 1 & 2 T24N R40E, Section 31 T25N R41E, and Sections 6 & 7 T24N R41E (Spokane County, WA).

SEPA Environmental Review: Spokane County has reviewed the proposed project for probable adverse environmental impacts and expects to issue a Determination of Nonsignificance (DNS). This determination is based on the following findings and conclusions:
