
NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Spokane as follows:

ORDINANCE FOR THE TOWN OF FAIRFIELD

WHEREAS, the Town of Fairfield (the "Town"), Spokane County, Washington is classified as a "town" under RCW 35.01.040; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to RCW 35.21.120 and RCW 35.21.152, a town may provide for solid waste handling by or under the direction of officials and employees of the town or may award contracts for any service related to solid waste handling including contracts entered into with public or private parties to utilize or operate publicly or privately owned or operated solid waste handling systems, plants, sites, or other facilities under such conditions as may be determined by the Town Council; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Attachment "B" of the Interlocal Agreement, the Town agreed to "adopt the draft (Spokane County Comprehensive Solid Waste Management Plan (the "SCCSWMP")) or any amendment, revision or update thereto so long same has been considered by" the Spokane County Solid Waste Advisory Committee, with the SCCSWMP to be "binding upon the Town" after approval or adoption by the State of Washington Department of Ecology; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Attachment "C" of the Interlocal Agreement, the Town agreed to "adopt and enforce [Spokane County]'s Flow Control Ordinance within its jurisdiction;'

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Council of the Town of Fairfield that:



WHEREAS, pursuant to RCW 35.21.120 and RCW 35.21.152, a city or town may provide for solid waste handling by or under the direction of officials and employees of the city or town or may award contracts for any service related to solid waste handling including contracts entered into with public or private parties to utilize or operate publicly or privately owned or operated solid waste handling systems, plants, sites, or other facilities under such conditions as may be determined by the Council; and

WHEREAS, on October 14, 2014, the Council adopted Resolution 2014-07, which pursuant to chapter 39.34 RCW approved that certain “Interlocal Agreement Between Spokane County and City of Millwood for Solid Waste Transfer and Disposal and Other Matters Related Thereto” (the “Interlocal Agreement”) a copy of which is attached hereto as Attachment “A”; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Attachment “B” of the Interlocal Agreement, the City agreed to “adopt the draft [Spokane County Comprehensive Solid Waste Management Plan (the “SCCSWMP”)] or any amendment, revision or update thereto so long same has been considered by” the Spokane County Solid Waste Advisory Committee, with the SCCSWMP to be “binding upon the City” after approval or adoption by the State of Washington Department of Ecology; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Attachment “C” of the Interlocal Agreement, the City agreed to “adopt and enforce [Spokane County]’s Flow Control Ordinance within its jurisdiction;”

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Millwood that:


