

AGREED RELOCATION

Motion for Ex Parte Order Modifying Parenting Plan

- You are the custodial parent; and
- There is no Objection filed or the other parent agrees with the move

SPOKANE COUNTY FAMILY COURT FACILITATOR

You have provided notice of your plan to move and a proposed new parenting plan. The other parent has not objected in the period to do so or is in agreement with the move. You are moving outside of the child's school district. The move will affect the other parent's rights. You can file this motion with no further notice to the other parent.

Note: If

- You have provided the other parent notice of your plan to move AND
- The other parent has not objected within the thirty-day period allowed AND
- You have NOT asked to change the parenting plan

THEN you do not need to file any motion at all. You automatically have permission to move after the objection period has run. You must keep following your existing parenting plan.

Checklist of Steps to Complete:

- _____ 1. Fill out the following papers completely. **Both parties must sign.** Print clearly in black ink or type.
 - () Parenting Plan (FL All Family 140)
 - () Ex Parte Motion for Final Order Changing Parenting Plan – No Objection to Moving With Children (Relocation) (FL Relocate 706)
 - () Ex Parte Order on Motion for Final Order Changing Parenting Plan – Moving With Children (Relocation) (FL Relocate 707)

- _____ 2. Make two copies (original plus two copies) of the documents.

- _____ 3. Go to the Clerk's Office, Room 300, between the hours of 8:30 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. and 1:00 p.m. – 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. Ask the clerk to have your court file pulled and taken to Ex Parte, Courtroom 304 (open 9 a.m. to 12 noon and 1:30 p.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday). Give your original documents to the clerk in Courtroom 304. Take a seat in the Courtroom and wait for the Court to sign your documents. The clerk will keep the original documents.

Once your documents have been signed by the Court, go back to the Clerk's Office (Room 300) and stamp your copies with the Judge/Court Commissioner's name and the date stamp. This completes your relocation action.
